**Cost:** \$100+30  
**Initial Chips:** 15,000  
**Rounds:** Limit Hold'em levels 1, 4, 7, and 10 are 15 minutes. Stud levels 2, 5, 8, and 11 are 18 minutes. Omaha levels 3, 6, 9, and 12 are 22 minutes. No Limit Hold'em levels 13 onward will be 20 minutes. 6 handed tables. Redraw to No Limit Hold'em final table at 7 players.

**Reentry and late registration will be allowed until the end of the first break.**

## Chowaha Rules

The game is played with a button and blinds.

Each player is dealt two cards face down, followed by a round of betting at the small bet limit.

Three flops are dealt one above the other forming a 3x3 square of cards. This is followed by a round of betting at the small bet limit.

Two turn cards are dealt vertically to the right of the flop cards from the dealer's perspective. This is followed by a round of betting at the big bet limit.

One river card is placed to the right of the turn cards. This is followed by a round of betting at the big bet limit. This is followed by a showdown.

At the showdown, the board will look like this:

The cards labelled X are the flop cards, the cards marked Y are the turn cards, and Z is the river card.

The best high hand wins the pot. The high hand consists of a player's two hole cards plus the cards from one flop, one turn adjacent to the flop being used, and the river. These may be played in any combination EXCEPT that board cards used CANNOT consist of the top row of the flop plus the bottom turn card or the bottom row of the flop plus the top turn card. That is, the flop, turn, and river must all be contiguous cards. Also, as in Omaha, each player must use both hole cards plus three cards from the board to form their hand.

# Double Board Pot Limit Omaha Tournament Structure

**Location:** Resorts World Las Vegas  
**Cost:** \$100+30  
**Initial Chips:** 30,000  
**Rounds:** All levels are 20 minutes. 8 handed tables. Final table redraw at 9 players.

Double Board Pot Limit Omaha plays like Pot Limit Omaha except that two boards are dealt. The pot is split, with half going to the best hand(s) on the top board and half going to the best hand(s) on the bottom board. **This tournament is not bomb pot format** – rather, there is an ordinary round of betting pre-flop.

**Reentry and late registration will be allowed until the end of the first break.**

\*The "Raise To" column assumes that you are first to enter the pot after the blinds pre-flop. The maximum raise is determined by the size of the pot, after first adding your implied call of the action to you. The minimum raise is two times the last blind or raise.

# No Limit Hold'em Double Green Chip Bounty Tournament Structure

**Time:** Saturday, February 3, 2024 at 11:00 am  
**Location:** Resorts World Las Vegas  
**Cost:** \$150+30 (\$50 of each entry goes towards that player's bounty)  
**Initial Chips:** 30,000  
**Rounds:** All levels are 20 minutes. 9 handed tables. Final table redraw at 9 players.

Each player carries a \$50 bounty token, which is awarded to the person busting that player. In the case of a chopped pot where two players simultaneously bust a player, the bounty is awarded to the player in the worst position. The player winning the tournament wins their own bounty.

Each hand, the big blind will post an ante equal to the amount of the big blind. When the final table reaches four handed play, the ante amount will be reduced to the amount of the small blind.

**Reentry and late registration will be allowed until the end of the first break.**

# B.O.S.S. (Big O + Super Stud) Tournament Structure

**Location:** Resorts World Las Vegas  
**Cost:** \$100+30  
**Initial Chips:** 20,000  
**Rounds:** All levels are 20 minutes. 6 handed tables. Final table redraw at 7 players.

The game will change every 6 hands. Both games are played fixed limit and are high/low split (8 or better). The tournament will begin with Big O. At the final table, the button and the game will both be drawn.

**Reentry and late registration will be allowed until the end of the first break.**

The table above is designed with the following necessary constraints:

- The last paying place always assures the participant of getting at least his money back.
- A higher place never pays less than a lower place in a given tournament.

The table above is also designed with the following arbitrary constraints:

- As the number of players increases, the percent of the field being paid is reduced, heading asymptotically to 10%.
- As the number of players increases, the percentage of the payout for a given place must not increase.
- As the paying place becomes worse, the number of players receiving the same payout will not decrease.
- For a given place, the gap between that payout level and the one above it must never be lower than the gap between a given payout and the one below it.
- For a given place as the number of participants goes up, when the payout percentage drops, the amount it drops must not be a greater amount than for any previous drop for a smaller number of entrants.
